5.	Choices have consequences Numbers 32.23 is a KEY VERSE that your children must know. Take a moment and highlight it in your Bible, write it down, and share its meaning with your children.
6.	But, Dad, everyone is seeing that movie If you have kids old enough to be "tweens" (ages 11-12) you've heard it. Use the website: www.pluggedinonline – to determine what they should and should not see. It will tell you how much profanity is in the film along with violence and sexual situations. Go to the Internet and look it up. Highly recommended.
7.	Colossians 3.23-25 makes four points: (1) have integrity on the job, v. 22, (2) do your best, v. 23, (3) know your <i>real</i> boss, v. 24, and (4) don't worry about everyone else. Developing great work ethic and attitude will take them far in the world. Discuss your observations.
8.	We must also teach them to be respectful when they are in the homes of others. Teach them to be respectful to their hosts, express appreciation, offer to help, and leave their room like they found it. What does it say about their upbringing when they show little regard for common courtesy and manners?
