3. What is meant by the phrase "how excellent is Your name"? (Psalm 8:1)

4. Discuss the significance of the psalmist's use of the words "consider" and "fingers" in Psalm 8:3. (Psalm 14:1; Exodus 31:18)

7.	What eight accolades for the perfection of the Law of the Lord does David speak of? (Psalm 19:7-11)
8.	List five categories into which David divided "the word of the Lord"? (Psalm 19:7-9)
9.	What is the greatest of all blessings that spring forth from obedience to God's Word? (Psalm 19:11-13)
10.	What principles do you find in these 2 psalms? Any personal applications you can make?
